

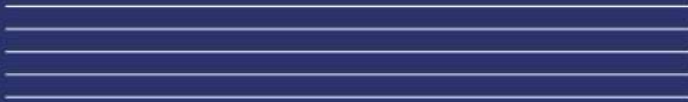

A YEAR OF IMPACT : DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION 2025-26

Fr. Raymond Memorial 2nd Basketball and 1st Badminton Tournament 2025-26



The Fr. Raymond Memorial 2nd Basketball and 1st Badminton Tournament 2025-26 was successfully held from April 25 to 26, 2025, at St. Joseph's Academy, Ghaziabad and the Court of Christ University, Delhi NCR. Organized by the Department of Education, St. John's Province, Bijnor, the event was a tribute to the late Rev. Fr. Raymond Mancheril CMI, a devoted missionary whose life and legacy continue to inspire generations.

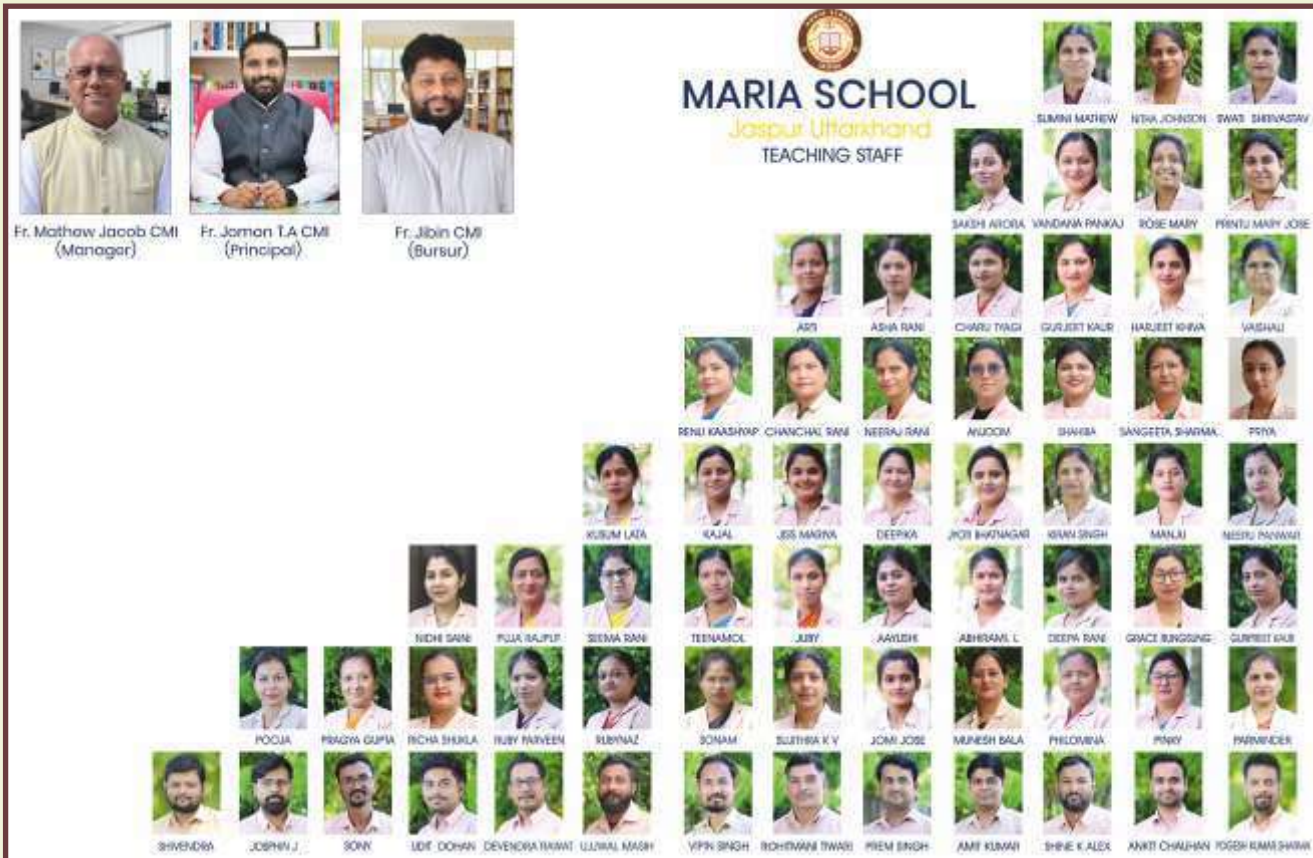

01 | ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENTS



ICSE (CLASS X) AND ISC (CLASS XII) BOARD EXAMINATION RESULTS – 2025

The academic year 2024–2025 has been a year of remarkable achievement and academic excellence for our school, as our students delivered outstanding performance in both the ICSE (Class X) and ISC (Class XII) Board Examinations. It is a matter of immense pride that the school achieved a 100% pass result in both ICSE and ISC, reflecting the dedication of our students and the committed guidance of our teachers.

In the ICSE Examination 2025, a total of 99 students appeared, and all students passed successfully. Among them, 26 students secured above 90%, 41 students scored above 80%, 20 students scored above 70%, and 11 students achieved above 60%, demonstrating strong academic consistency. The school topper, Shourya Jain, secured an outstanding 98.6%, followed by Sonakshi Sharma with 96.2%, and Pranjali Jain with 95.8%, bringing great pride to the institution.

In the ISC Examination 2025, a total of 61 students appeared, and the school once again achieved a 100% success rate. Among them, 19 students scored above 90%, 26 students scored above 80%, 8 students scored above 70%, and 8 students scored above 60%, reflecting commendable academic performance. The ISC toppers were Karan Kumar with 96.25%, Shiv Gupta with 96.25%, and Granthi Gupta with 95.75%, whose achievements serve as a source of inspiration for all.

The academic year 2025–2026 began on a promising note, marked by the collaborative efforts of the staff and the generous support of parents and the wider community. This report presents a comprehensive account of the school's progress from September 2025 to February 2026, highlighting key areas such as student admissions, academic and co-curricular activities, infrastructure development, and major events.

01 | ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENTS

COMMENCEMENT OF CLASSES

Regular classes began on September 8, 2025. The transition into the new academic year was smooth, with enthusiastic participation from both students and staff.

STUDENT ADMISSIONS AND ENROLMENT

● Enrolment Figures

Student enrolment increased significantly during the year. Although some students left, the admission of 105 new students raised the school population to 376 students.

● Staffing Adjustments

For the 2025–2026 academic year, three new teachers joined the staff, along with two trainee teachers assigned to the Nursery and Kindergarten sections. One teacher proceeded on study leave, while another went on maternity leave at the beginning of the academic year. At present, the school has a total of 26 staff members, including the Proprietor and the Headmaster.



ACADEMIC PROGRESS

With the introduction of Basic Four this academic year, CMI Marriet School has attained the status of an upper primary school. Computer Studies has now become an official subject for the Basic Four students. With the generous support of his Austrian friends, Rev. Fr. Saviour Menachery CMI donated 27 laptops to the school's computer laboratory. Classes were conducted effectively throughout the two terms, and the staff's dedication ensured a high standard of teaching and learning.

6.2 WORKSHOPS & TRAININGS

FACULTY DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME



A two-day Faculty Development Programme on Team Building was held at Christ University NCR Campus on 9-10 December 2025. The entire faculty of SHDC and SHIMT participated enthusiastically.

The visit helped students understand supply chain coordination, quality control, and large-scale service management in a social enterprise setting.

WORKSHOP ON FINANCIAL STATEMENT ANALYSIS

The Department of Commerce organized a One-Day Workshop on Financial Statement Analysis to enhance students' practical understanding of interpreting annual reports and preparing basic financial models using Microsoft Excel.

The workshop aimed at bridging the gap between theoretical concepts and real-world financial analysis, especially in the context of Indian banking, insurance, and corporate sectors. Students were trained to analyze balance sheets, profit and loss statements, and cash flow statements.

Through case studies and hands-on sessions, participants developed analytical skills and learned ratio analysis, trend analysis, and financial forecasting techniques. The session proved highly beneficial in preparing students for careers in finance and accounting.

INDUSTRY VISIT – AMUL BANAS DAIRY PLANT

Students of SHIMT and SHDC visited the Amul Banas Dairy plant in Lucknow as part of their industrial exposure program. The visit provided firsthand knowledge of the operations of a leading dairy cooperative under the Amul brand.

Students observed the complete process from milk procurement and chilling to production, quality testing, packaging, and cold chain management. Officials explained the cooperative model, farmer engagement strategies, and the importance of quality assurance in maintaining brand trust.

The interaction helped students understand supply chain management, cooperative governance, and marketing strategies in the dairy industry.



WORKSHOP ON ONLINE SAFETY & RESPONSIBLE GAMING

The IQAC organized a Workshop on Online Safety & Responsible Gaming for the Departments of Computer Science and Management Studies.
